D. BACKGROUND AND EXPERIENCE

NOVA Foundation was set up in 2009. We are a non-governmental, non-profit organization. Our aim is to promote the lifelong learning idea. From the very beginning NOVA is planning, conducting and evaluating various types of educational activities and support programs, which are including non-vocational and vocational courses, workshops and seminars. We believe in saying: "It is never too late to learn", that's why we are constantly trying to expand our offer and allow as many people as possible to learn new skills, which will improve quality of their lives, their engagement, social inclusion and knowledge. Approximately 2000 people participate in our activities and projects each year.

Our main areas of activities are:

1. COMMUNITY CENTRE - on a daily basis we are running a community centre called **Neighborhood Energy Incubator**. We are inviting local residents to take part in the multiple group activities and educational courses. We are offering social support and allowing access to the public information.
2. ADULT EDUCATION – Every year we organize between 50 and 100 non-vocational courses/trainings/events for adults organized every year.
3. VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) – Every year we organize approx. 100 courses to allow participants to improve their knowledge, know-how, skills and competences required in particular occupations or to boost their chances on the employment market.
4. SOCIAL ECONOMY & INNOVATIONS - we are involved in social economy since 2005, we set up, run and supported social cooperatives (Social Brewery, Social Canteen & Catering, Charity Shops)

NOVA Foundation is working in a close partnership with Gdansk City Council since 2016. We are involved in the revitalization process of one of the most damaged (social and infrastructural) districts in Gdansk called Stary Chelm (Old Helmet). We have created there a Community Centre called **Neighborhood Energy Incubator (ISEChelm)**, which we are running on a daily basis. We are inviting local citizens to take part in the multiple group activities and educational courses. We are offering social support and allowing access to the public information.

Since 2019 ISEChelm is following operating models of German (Volkshochschule) & Scandinavian (Folkhögskola) educational centres. We have built a relationship with German VHS, who are tutoring and supporting us in boosting our offer. Each year we are providing significant number of courses mainly for adults, who are interested in learning new skills and gaining new knowledge, which will contribute to improving their personal lives and professional careers. We are working closely with local community and other groups including: youth, socially excluded, unemployed, disabled, elderly. Our Foundation is introducing new educational models, which will help to close education gaps in our local community. We are providing training in various subjects mainly in the field of the key competences. All our courses are run by the qualified professionals (e.g. social workers, teachers, NGO workers).

In 2019 we've issued 1113 certificates for our VET and AE students. We have run approx. 150 events and we have had over 1000 participants.

NOVA employs 5 permanent full- time staff members, who are qualified trainers and tutors, they are responsible for coordinating all our educational projects. Additionally we are working closely with a large number of external educators and trainers (yearly approx. 50), who are able to provide training in variety of subjects including ICT, psychology, therapy, entrepreneurship, soft skills and many more. Our tutors are constantly working on improving their knowledge and skills. Until now we were actively developing our actions on the national level. As a next step and adhering to our long term strategy, we are going to broaden our horizons and using our experience and skills develop on the international level. Therefore we are searching for experienced Erasmus+ partner, who will support us in this journey.

We are believing in a life-long learning idea.</p> <p>We are focusing most of our courses around the 8 key competences, which are including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • communication in the mother language, • communication in foreign languages, • mathematical skills and basic knowledge of science and technology, • IT, • learning how to learn, • social studies, • sense of initiative and entrepreneurship; • cultural awareness and expression. <p>Below we will talk in more detail about our past experience, which will be beneficial to this project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Knowledge and experience in digital skills certification</u> <p>We are European Digital Competence Certificate (ECCC) Foundation Partner and accredited Examination Center since 2017. We are organising and conducting ECCC exams in Poland. More about ECCC certification system (http://www.ecccf.eu/certification/about-eccc/): ECCC Foundation contributed and helped JRC of European Commission to shape DigComp 2.0 and 2.1 and provided its expertise in their validation process. For the development of a digital competence validation standard inspired by the European Digital Competence framework for Citizens, the ECCC Foundation has been nominated for the European Commission's DIGITAL SKILLS AWARD 2016</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Introducing digital skills to disabled people</u> <p>One of our specialties are digital skills/ ICT courses for disabled people. We've got experience working with both physically and mentally disabled. During years of experiences we have created and tested multiple methods of working with those participants. We are happy to share our experience with other partners and we can help them to understand the idea of working with disabled. We can prepare Intellectual Output – guideline for educators (how to work with disabled on the digital skills development) .</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>EU project management experiences</u> <p>We are well experienced in EU project management (mainly European Social Fund, EOG Funds, we are less experienced in Erasmus +, however one of our employees is a Projects and Reports Evaluator for the National Agency, that's why we have a lot of knowledge from this angle).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • TARGET GROUPS: <p>Our main target groups are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • LOCAL RESIDENTS- actively participating in Neighborhood Energy Incubator activities (workshops, events, seminars, meetings), • YOUTH - we support out of school activities, such as youth exchange, volunteering and youth trainings, • SOCIALLY EXCLUDED AND DISABLED - we provide educational courses, social and professional reintegration services for disabled; one of our main activities for disabled is the innovative course of immersiotherapy (scuba diving basics helping with a better social integration) • UNEMPLOYED AND EMPLOYED - we provide career & employment counseling and nonvocational courses,
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ELDERLY - as a Community Centre we provide multiple educational and recreational activities for elderly people; we are responsible for providing social care to 20 of them, using an innovative telehealth care devices. • DISSEMINATION: Due to the fact that we are working closely with a large number of local and regional institutions, we have variety of dissemination channels and tools, which we normally use in our projects. The main ones are: • FB @isechelm – we’ve gathered almost 1400 followers on our FB page, we are using this channel to distribute information about all our activities and workshops. • Local community centres and NGOs network – there are approx. 20 local community centres in Gdansk (almost 600 000 community members) – we are in the constant contact and cooperation. • Local libraries, schools, health clinics and churches - word of mouth marketing, which we normally use. It is based on our regular cooperation with the above mentioned institutions. • Webpage fundacjanova.org.pl – this is an additional channel; we are currently working on improving our website. • Local information point in the Neighborhood Energy Incubator ISEChelm.
